Basic Skills in Research for Grass-root workers

- **Objective of the Course :**
- To develop ability to recognize & utilize research as a problem solving process in social work practice.
- To develop ability to utilize simple research process & to conduct simple need based survey relevant to field practice.

- **Who is a Grass-root worker?**
- A Grass-root worker is the one who has acquired training: paraprofessional course and / or diploma in Social work / or on Job trainee in the field of social work and community animator.

- **Nature of course:**
- Nature of research project: Individual research
- **2 Credit Course** – Three times a week for two hours
- 2 Month theory and 1 month practice
- Assessment through presentation: Tools for data collection and report presentation of Group research and PRA presentation by the group.
