The College of Social Work- Nirmala Niketan since its inception in 1955 has been dedicated in its pursuit of excellence in social work education. At various junctures, the College of Social Work has made efforts in updating its knowledge base and making its educational initiatives relevant to the existing national and global socio-economic reality. The College provides generic courses of study both at the M.S.W. and the B.S.W. levels. A semester system of three years has been adopted for the B.S.W. course since 2009, and the Credit Based Semester Grading System, initiated by the University of Mumbai started for B.S.W from 2011-2012 and for MSW from 2012-2013.

The curriculum is carefully designed to ensure that the student has a broad base of the necessary knowledge, skills and attitudes to function in a variety of settings related to the existing employment opportunity in the development sector. Despite being generic, the course also encourages the students to deepen their interest in certain specific areas through the type of fieldwork selected, research study undertaken, seminar paper and elective subjects.

The curriculum consists of relevant aspects of both theory and field work to help students enhance their practical understanding of social work practice. Field Work is an integral part of the training programme in social work. It comprises learning professional social work practice under the guidance of trained field instructors in selected Government and Non-Government organizations. It is both goal-oriented to solve a particular problem to which the student addresses his / her activities and learner-centred in relation to his / her particular interest areas and aptitudes. Field work has the dual purpose of promoting the student's own learning while contributing to the development of the people with whom he / she works, especially the disadvantaged sections of our society.

The college has been awarded the grade of academic excellence by the National Accreditation and Assessment Cell (NAAC) the highest score in all the three cycles. In 2001 the College was awarded a five star status; in 2007 the College was awarded an A+ with an Institutional Score of 93 percent and in 2015 it was reaccredited (Third Cycle) with A Grade (3.53 CGPA out of 4) valid up to 2022. We are happy to announce that on 12th Feb 2019, The University Grants Commission has provided conferment of Autonomous Status to the College of Social Work, Nirmala Niketan for a period of ten years w.e.f 2019-2020 to 2028-2029.

With the Autonomous status we have started add-on credit courses such as Art Based Therapy, Basic Research Skills for grass root social workers, Advance research in qualitative and quantitative methods, Media and Communication, Social Entrepreneurships skills enhancing livelihood from this academic year 2019, which helps our students with additional skills in their professional career as Social workers.

The College of Social Work was founded in 1955 by a band of valiant women known as Daughters of the Heart of Mary, whose mission was to readily respond to the felt needs of the people according to the signs of the time.

In the years following the Independence of India, the founders -Ms Paiva Couceiro, Ms Collette Galby and Dr Dorothy Baker realized that the nation's struggle for development would be served not so much by sensitive social concern as by insightful committed action. This led to the conceptualization of a programme of Social Work education to prepare young people to undertake and assist in resolving the existing social problems: widespread poverty, ill health, unemployment, illiteracy and social inequalities.

The academic programme was then built on a vision of human dignity and social justice especially with regards to the underprivileged. The College has forged ahead addressing various concerns of human existence and today (2018) in its sixty third year of existence - has become one of the pioneering institutes of social work education in the country.

Library

Started in the year 1958, The Library has now a collection of 24,369 books in "Social Work" and related subjects like Politics, Sociology, Psychology, Anthropology, Psychiatry, Economics/Labour Economics, Social Research, Statistics, Welfare Services, Medical Social Work, Criminology and Social Welfare Administration, Community Organisation, Public Welfare Administration etc. The selection of the material in the library is geared to meet the academic needs of undergraduate and graduate students in social work. Although this is a specialized library, books of general interest, magazines, journals, fiction and many others are also available.

Lecture Series

We have two Lecture Series namely- Dorothy Baker and Savitri Phule lectures. These lectures are held every year and have mandatory attendance. The Guest speakers are eminent and inspiring personalities from various fields like politics, academics, media, social work, bureaucrats, activist etc.



Counselling Services

Counsellor offers counselling to students for their psychological problems. The issues range from relationship issues, parental/family conflicts, poor attendance, fieldwork related stress, financial crisis, career choices, issues related to self-acceptance, etc. Counselling services are extended to students of short terms courses, college staff and faculty as well.



Research Unit

Since 1993, the Research Unit of the College has been conducting a number of social work research studies. The Research Unit conducts independent research as well as commissioned research studies for Local, State and National Government and National/International Agencies. The Research Unit focuses on systematic, fact-based and action-oriented research that creates user-friendly social work related knowledge for social work education and practice, social policy and advocacy. The Research Unit has a nominated Director a Senior Faculty member, with a Ph.D, with a core team of a Research Coordinator, a Senior Research Assistant and an Accountant. The Research Unit has created a cadre of young social workers committed to pursuing quality research and indigenous documentation.



Field Work Experience

Events

Field Work is an integral part of our BSW & MSW programmes. It consists of practicing social work under the guidance of trained field instructors in selected social welfare agencies and organizations. It enables our students to see the applicability of theoretical knowledge taught in the classroom to actual situations requiring social work intervention.

Our fieldwork is goal-oriented i.e. students conduct activities that aim to help solving particular social problems. It is also learner oriented i.e. the activities conducted are in relation to specific interests and aptitude of our students. Our fieldwork has the dual purpose of promoting the student's own learning while contributing to the development of the people with whom he / she works, especially the disadvantaged sections of our society. The students receive individualized attention in the form of guidance and supervision from the teaching faculty.

Practical experience in fieldwork enables our students to:

- Integrate classroom learning and field practice through active supervision & feedback
- Develop skills that may be utilized on field, for analyzing problems that affect the target groups and selecting appropriate means for redresser.
- Cultivate attitudes and values relevant to working with the most disadvantaged sections of society
- Develop awareness of self and the way in which students' behaviour is affected by past experiences and cultural factors, and the way in which these affect their response to others.

Our fieldwork is given equal importance as any of the theory subjects. In order to evaluate Fieldwork, there are four criteria- Analytical Ability, Problem-solving skills, Professional Development and Use of field instruction. This is coupled with writing reports every week and other documentation tasks.





Placement Rules and Guidelines for Recruiting Organizations (RO)

The placement process for our College is undertaken by the Career Guidance and Job Placement Cell. Information provided by the Recruiting organization (RO) will be beneficial in slotting dates and furthering the recruitment process on our Campus. After deciding the time slot, the same will be communicated to the RO for confirmation.

For smooth functioning of the placement process, ROs are required to abide by the following rules:

• Organizations interested in recruiting students graduating in MSW and BSW from our college will have to communicate their requirement via a prescribed Placement Form. The same needs to be signed by the concerned authority and emailed to swplacements@yahoo.co.in

 The procedure for allocation of slots to prospective ROs will be done according to the following details provided by RO:

- a. Job profile being offered
- b. Remuneration and incentives
- c. Geographical location and mobility
- d. Number of positions offered
- The placement process will comprise of the following:
- 1. RO will conduct a Pre-Placement Talk for students at college campus on a mutually convenient date before the placement process.
- 2. During the Pre-Placement Talk, RO will make a maximum 20 minute of presentation about the organization and details of the Job offered. RO will also describe the selection procedure. Towards the end, a 10 minute of Q&A session will help address gueries of the students.
