Celebration of Friendship Week 2019

Preliminary Planning meetings

The Convener and members met in the month of June and July 2019, and in August shared via email of ideas for celebrating;

Friendship day was to be planned for along with the student representative of WDC, once the Student elections were over. Resource person's names and themes for the lecture series and women's day event were brainstormed.

Meeting held on 14 Aug 2019 for Friendship day celebration

Present for the meeting: Convener and all members & student representative.

Few ideas were shared by the members present such as, to have a resource person to talk on 'values of friendship' or 'friendship relationship in current generation', to have event where students exchange friendship bands, or to have some activity and competition on theme of friendship. The convener and student representative came up with idea of friendship week (21-28 Aug 2019) with students expressing their unique experiences of friendship on a chart/wall, culminated by a inter class competition/ event with Role-plays on theme of 'Values of Friendship'.

Roles and responsibilities of members to prepare for the event were delegated by the convener so that we could fulfill individual roles as well as work together as a team.

- Program schedule was prepared so that there is clarity of activities. MC was scripted based on the program schedule.
- Posters were prepared and put up in all class rooms and notice board, a week ahead.

- Announcements & reminders were made by Ms. Nirmiti and class teachers in the class room and to the CRs about the friendship wall and the Role plays event.
- Budget was prepared to allot money for planned expenses and keep a track of the same.
- Invitation letters were sent to the Judges. Finally Sr Raina, Ms Sulbha and Dr Smita were judges.
- Criterion for judging the role plays was prepared.
- Potted plants as tokens for judges and Prizes for winners were handmade boxes with a friendship day message.

Friendship Week and Interclass Role Play competitions

The week hopefully allowed students to reflect on their friendships and share about its uniqueness on the friendship wall. Students shared poems, pictures and some interesting thoughts.

The interclass Role-play competitions took place on 28 August 2019 at 2 pm in the College Hall. The student representative was the MC. She welcomed the Principal, Faculty, non teaching staff and students for the event and shared a few thoughts about meaning and importance of friendships in the life of students. She then called upon Dr Prabha, Convener of WDC to introduce the theme of the day's event and welcome the audience.

The week started from 7th March 2020 and was concluded on 12th of March 2020. Following were the events organized-

• An activity of completing the sentences was taken with the help of women representatives of each classes. - Internationally, purple is a color for symbolizing women. Historically the combination of purple, green and white to symbolize women's equality originated from the Women's Social and Political Union in the UK in 1908. Purple signifies justice and dignity. Purple day was celebrated on 9th March 2020.
- A **poster competition** was announced on 10th March 2020. The theme for the competition aligned with the International Women's Day theme, i.e. Generations for equality. Students from all the classes took active part in the competition. **International Womens Day Pledge was also conducted for the college by Dr. Smita Bammidi**.

International Women's Day pledge in MSW-II The Krantijyoti Savitribai lecture Series was organized on 11th March 2020 along with the celebration of International Women's Day. A photo booth and a tattoo booth was organized for the students along with the lecture series. Dr. Manisha Gupte was invited as the Chief Guest Speaker for the lecture series. Manisha Gupte has been part of the women's movement since the mid-1970s. She has also been an activist in the health and civil rights movements in India. She co-founded MASUM, a rural women's organisation in 1987, after living in a drought prone rural area for five years and has been its co-convenor since then. She spent one year in the Dept. of International Health at the Johns Hopkins University, Baltimore as a visiting fellow. She is actively associated with pro-people and progressive organisations nationally, regionally and internationally as an advisor, trainer or board member. She has participated in and has promoted campaigns related to women's health, violence against women, sexuality and minority rights. She has also worked on policy issues with the state and central governments in India over the past two decades. She was the coordinator of the 10th International Women and Health meeting (IWHM), held in New Delhi in September 2005.

The lecture series highlighted many important points on gender equality, intersectionality and gender justice. The speaker, in her specialized way of conveying made students understand many concepts easily, she gave simple day-to-day examples of naming systems followed by the society and patriarchal basis behind them. The lecture series left the students with many insights and questions to further reflect on. She gave examples of a Bollywood film, Hum apke hai koun, and the related patriarchal insights on the film. The practice of renaming women after marriages and the base behind the practice was shared. The speaker too the students and staff through an enriching experience. She talked on many interlinked topics.

The lecture series was followed by Street Play performed by Students Placed in Sakhya. Ms. Jaini Gudhka coordinated and introduced the play.

Ms. Sharayu Ghorpade studying in MSW- I performed the mono-act, on "Vhay, mi Savitribai". She performed the play from Savitibai's perspective. The play took us through her journey and views of Savitribai on the contemporary times. The prizes of the poster completion taken were declared, the winners were —
